Daily Reading Reminder:

Our daily reading has improved a lot in Hedgehog class over the last half term and as a result the children are really enjoying their reading and are being able to access more of the curriculum confidently.

Just a reminder for the daily reading and how it works:

To help them with this we are asking for the children to read 4 out of the 5 days a week. We understand the children are very busy but fitting in 10 minutes of reading a day will allow them to make fantastic progress and hopefully fall in love with reading. Once they have read, please record this in their new homework diary books. A picture below shows how their new diaries can be used. Each morning, when the children come into school, we will be looking in their diaries to see if they have read. If the children have not been able to read 4 out of the 5 times in the week, they can have some catch up reading time during Friday Breaktime. We believe this will support and improve their reading as they move through the year and then the school.

New Homework:

Year 2:

- Daily 10-minute reading with a minimum 4 reading sessions a week.
- Look at and practise how you wish the spellings which come home on the bookmark.
- Listen to times table songs for 2s, 5s, 10s. This may include YouTube or BBC Supermovers (KS1)
- Any extra activities you wish to do on purple mash would be welcomed

All home learning to be recorded on the homework side of their diaries.

Year 3:

- Daily 10-minute reading with a minimum 4 reading sessions a week.
- Look at and practise how you wish the spellings which come home on the bookmark.
- Listen to times table songs for 2s, 3s, 4s, 5s, 10s. This may include YouTube or BBC Supermovers (KS1 & KS2)
- Use of times table related games such as hit the button. Other games can be found on Topmarks for free.

All home learning to be recorded on the homework side of their diaries.
