Thank you to everyone who came to our welcome event to see our new classroom. We hope you enjoyed it as much as we do!








# **Skylark Class**

In Skylark Class, we have had a brilliant time welcoming Miss Minchin and Miss Halford to our classroom and have amazed them with our work.

In writing, we have used 'Ruby's Worry' as a stimuli for our writing. In particular, we have been learning about how we demarcate sentences with capital letters and full stops as well as the sizing of our letters. After reading Ruby's Worry, we chose parts of the story to reinvent and wrote some brilliant narrative sentences- using our own ideas and the punctuation that we had learned about. In Geography, we have been learning about how to create pictorial maps. We thought about what areas of our school we would need to include on a map for somebody to navigate their way around Longney and then we used different symbols to create our own maps. We put our maps to the test and we're pleased to say that everyone could use our maps without getting lost!









## **Goldfinch Class**

We have thoroughly enjoyed our learning- this term- particularly, our Geography. We have learned about the local geography of Longney and about some of the features of Longney, including the River Severn. There were lots of materials on offer for us to make our own maps of Longney- we had dice representing the church and place value counters representing the river. Our trip to Gloucester was an opportunity for us to apply our map reading and direction skills to the test; navigating our way through Gloucester. We were fortunate enough to also visit Gloucester museum to learn about the historical geography of Gloucester.









## **Swift Class**

In Swift Class, we have been enjoying getting stuck into our writing units- this term. We have used 'Wolves of Willoughby Chase' and our learning, in Geography, about Gloucestershire to write narratives, formal letters and information reports. Additionally, we have been working in harmony and using compassion to start peer-editing our writing. We have enjoyed learning about invasion games, in PE. Atlas coaches are with us twice a week and, this term, we have been playing a range of games to learn, practise and apply skills needed in invasion games.

As well as all of the learning we have done in the classroom, we have been thinking about how we can use our roles as: buddies, adventure playground team, sports ambassadors, worship team and house captains in the wider school. We have already come up with lots of ideas and we are excited to share them with you, over the year.













## **Harvest Festival**
