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Next year and beyond...

It has been a real whirlwind of a year for us all at Longney – there have been several changes since this time last summer which we know must have felt overwhelming for you as families and we cannot thank you enough for the support and patience you have shown throughout, as we come to the end of our first year here as a team.

One of the most important things anyone ever taught me as a leader is to 'keep the main thing, the main thing'. What this means is that we must take the long-term journey of development one step at a time. There is so much that I know Longney can be and offer as a school as it has done in the past, including far richer links into the community, a broader and more exciting curriculum and extra-curricular offer for your children and a vision which will give them all they need to grow in to confident, independent learners. However, into the future, my job is to ensure that all these important aspects of our school are not provided at the expense of the building blocks of learning – reading, writing and maths. As you know from the Ofsted report in February, this year the focus has had to be on building strong foundations in these areas. This meant bringing in a new phonics scheme and developing the EYFS curriculum, classroom and outdoor area so that all children who enter school will have chance to reach their early learning goals. We have focussed on developing the reading, writing and maths curriculum and assessment systems so all children can learn all they need to be ready for the next steps in their learning at the end of each year. We have also of course focussed on setting high expectations for all, including with learning and play behaviours which will allow the school to be an inclusive environment, which works for every child.

I wanted to let you all know though that these strong foundations we have built are only the start. This year is not the end product; we are only just beginning. The start of the next part of our continued journey of development is of course to secure the highest quality teachers for your children. I'm very pleased to say that Miss Woolway and Miss Hoskins have both agreed to take on permanent contracts at Longney so that they will be able to carry on the wonderful work that they have started in EYFS and Key Stage 1 into the future.

With Mr Le Templier moving on to pastures new, to give consistency and provide you with a leader who is incredibly passionate about your children and the future of this school, Miss Prosser will be taking on the role of senior teacher and continuing in her role of SENCO. I cannot tell you how excited I am about this. As those of you who know her will understand, Miss Prosser is an incredible teacher who is completely dedicated to all the children in her care. Miss Prosser will provide a port of call for yourselves and the staff when I am not on site and we will of course be in constant contact to ensure consistency for the children.

Finally, last week we interviewed a number of teachers and I'm happy to share that following this, Miss Hannah Fry will be joining us from September. Her lesson was one of the strongest interview lessons I have seen since I became a Headteacher. We know that Hannah will add so much to our team and continue to provide the high expectations which Mr LeTemplier has set this year – we are excited for you to meet her!

Well done Year 6 – we are all so proud of you!




Vision

This term, the teachers have booked in a number of visits to build relationships with PC Kim who works locally to support our community. She has been in to school on several occasions giving the children chance to get to know her and hear from her on a range of subjects including road safety, the role of the police and how to stay safe online. You may have heard about Miss Woolway being handcuffed for stealing a necklace recently (!), I'm pleased to confirm that this was part of a role play in our assembly with the children acting out a full police investigation including Matthew reading Miss Woolway her rights! Swallows and Skylarks were also lucky enough to have chance to try on uniforms and even see inside PC Kim's police van. All of these visits to school are so important as the children learn to trust the police as a provider of care and support in their local community and learn from a respected outside source some really key safety messages.



Knex Challenge

A huge well done to Emily and Kaylin who went along to Renishaw for the final of the Knex Challenge having been the winning pair chosen after the first round in school. They had chance to see a huge engineering firm in action and took part in the final alongside schools from all over Gloucestershire. They built an eco-friendly refuse truck with working mechanism and presented it to the judges. Thank you to Emily and Kaylin for representing the school so well in both rounds.

Outdoor areas

Going into next year, we are planning to develop the outside areas at school so that they can be used as much as possible going forwards. We have not been able to use the school to the best of its abilities this year as the spaces are not fully safe for the children to explore, with a lot of older equipment needing to be removed and replaced. As I've said above, we hope to use one of the large built in cupboards at the back of school to provide a boot room for the children. This will mean the new build frontage where the beautiful windows give a fantastic view of the school will be clear of discarded wellies!

Mrs Hinde is currently sourcing a local company to re-do the markings on the playground so they provide an inviting play area which I'm sure you agree will make a huge difference.

At the back of school, you will see over the coming weeks our handyman removing old play equipment and clearing the site so that we can then, supported by the funds raised by FOLS this year, buy new equipment for the children and develop this space for use as a play and learning space. The children will be able to play during breaks, sit under the new canopy for outdoor lessons, garden as part of our science curriculum and make the most of this space for forest school when needed in the winter months, including the lovely seating area at the back which just needs a spruce up!

Please do support the FOLS events coming up so that we have enough funds to provide your children with a purposeful and fun space so that they can be outside as much as possible throughout the coming years.

Bikeability

Well done to the year 5 children who were able to take part in bikeability. This gives them chance to learn their bikes safely on the road with trained bike safety teachers. They showed courage and perseverance to learn these important safety skills.
